

## Directory of Services for Children and Young People

Oldham Safeguarding Partnership has set out a Continuum of Need model, this ranges from children receiving "Universal" support – so considering every child, then considering those with low level needs to those whose needs are more acute requiring specialist intervention. Children's needs can and will change and it is imperative that practitioners are able to support a smooth transition across the continuum. This ensures that we provide the right intervention and help at the lowest possible level and the earliest possible time.



The Partnership are committed to integrated and multi-agency working at all levels. The levels of need shown within the windscreen model demonstrate how we will respond to the requirements of children and families across all levels of need and risk. Therefore, to further enhance multi-agency working, Oldham Safeguarding Children's Partnership have produced a directory of services to assist all partners and relevant agencies in helping support children, young people and their families at universal and universal plus so that they can access services in their local area and beyond to ensure that the right help is given to them at the right time.


