Welcome to the Oldham Safeguarding Children Partnership Training Programme April – July 2025 Edition

The purpose of inter-agency training is to foster and develop the following, to achieve better outcomes for children:

A shared understanding of the tasks, processes, principles, roles and responsibilities outlined in national guidance and local arrangements for safeguarding children and prompting their welfare.

Improved communication and information sharing between professionals, including a common understanding of key terms, definitions and thresholds for action.

Effective working relationships and communication.

Sound child focused assessments and decision making.

Learning from local and national child safeguarding practice reviews.

Charging Policy

Please ensure you are aware of our attendance and cancellation policy. We appreciate that at times agencies may need to cancel places reserved on training courses. However, this can be costly in terms of wasted resources, therefore the OSCP expects applicants to observe the following procedure:

All cancellations/withdrawals from training course should be made in writing at least 5 working days in advance of the course to OSCPtraining@oldham.gov.uk and cc catherine.lawler@oldham.gov.uk.

When advanced notice (5 working days) is not possible the applicant's line manager must notify of the reasons for non- attendance in writing. Telephone cancellations will NOT be accepted.

Charges for non-attendance are:

£75.00	for a half day or one day course
£150.00	for a 2-day course
£25.00	for a briefing session – please note the expectation is you must arrive on time for a briefing, the £25.00 fee also applies to late arrival.

The application email requesting a place on training does not guarantee your place on a course. After the course closing date if you are allocated a place on your requested course, you will receive a full confirmation via e-mail which will contain the full details of the course, venue etc.

Training Levels

Foundation

- Those who have contact with children who may become aware of possible abuse and neglect
- i.e. adult services, GPs, elected members, receptionists. Council staff, faith groups, voluntary sector.

Core 1

- Those who predominantly work with children and/or who have responsibility for safeguarding within their organisation
- i.e. housing, youth justice, police, probation, health, education, children social care, voluntary sector, designated leads, early help, specialist services.

Core 2

- Those whose work contributes to assessment, planning interventions, and reviewing the needs of a child.
- Those with responsibility to contribute/coordinate section 47 enquiries, assessments and plans
- Those responsible for supervision, management and strategic oversight, named persons
- i.e. paediatricians, managers, probation, police, health, education, housing, children's social care.

Neglect Matters

Childhood Neglect is a priority for Oldham Safeguarding Children Partnership.

This course will identify various ways children may be neglected and how neglect affects a child's all-round development. It will explore how to recognize children who are suffering, or who are at risk of suffering neglect, identify family and environmental factors that may contribute to neglect, and gain an overview of the local picture.

Understanding Exploitation

Core 1 & 2

Thursday 15th May 2025

(9.30am - 4.30pm)

This new course is delivered by members of Oldham's Complex Safeguarding Team and representatives from services supporting children and adults in Oldham, and links into the **Serious Youth Violence priority of the Children's Safeguarding Partnership**. It aims to equip practitioners with enhanced knowledge and skills to identify and respond appropriately to the exploitation of children, young people and adults.

The purpose of the course is to raise awareness about Criminal, Sexual and Financial exploitation including Modern Slavery and Cuckooing, and to help practitioners recognise the potential signs of exploitation and risk factors. The session focuses on how best to offer help and support, the local response pathways and local practitioner resources available; highlights national and local learning; and covers aspects including the point of view of survivors, complex safeguarding, intersectionality and transitions planning for young people preparing for adulthood.

Neglect Advanced

Neglect is one of Oldham Safeguarding Children Partnership priorities. This new course focuses on identifying and assessing risk and protective factors within families and community. It will examine the parameters of a good assessment and highlight what effective planning looks like. It will explore helpful approaches, engagement and interventions when working with children and families where neglect is an issue and is geared towards those professionals conducting/contributing to assessment.

Making a Child Protection Referral

Aligned with getting the right help at the right time priority of the OSCP this course will consolidate and reinforce knowledge of the meaning of child protection and abuse. It will provide up to date information and underline existing knowledge as to what to do if they are concerned a child is at risk. This training will focus on taking participants through the role of the MASH and what would constitute as a good referral into MASH. It will look at safeguarding/child protection, processes and what to do if you are worried about a child.

Safeguarding Children with Disabilities

This course aims to enhance professional understanding of the key issues relating to disability, child protection & safeguarding. It will examine the challenges for workers & agencies raised by Serious Case Reviews in this area. It will scrutinise and map evidence-based assessment frameworks to guide practice and examine specific considerations in relation to **child neglect (a priority for the Safeguarding Children Partnership)** and emotional abuse.
